SOFT VINYL ENCLOSURES:				
	Remove movable soft vinyl vents from their frames			
	Be sure to label where each vent goes for easy reinstall			
	ACRYLIC ENCLOSURES:			
	Acrylic sliders shall be removed from their frames in the event of hurricane force winds			
	Be sure to label each window for easy reinstall			
	ALUMINUM ROOF SYSTEMS:			
On top of roof surface visually check for:				
	Loose flashing or protector panels			
	Corroded or unsealed screws/fasteners			
	Condition of roof sealant and coatings (if applicable)			
Under roof visually check for:				
	Condition of beam to posts bolts			
	Condition of post to concrete anchors (quantity and size, missing screws, etc.)			
	Ensure all gutters and downspouts are firmly attached and clear of debris to prevent water buildup			
	Lower and secure clamshell awnings (if applicable)
